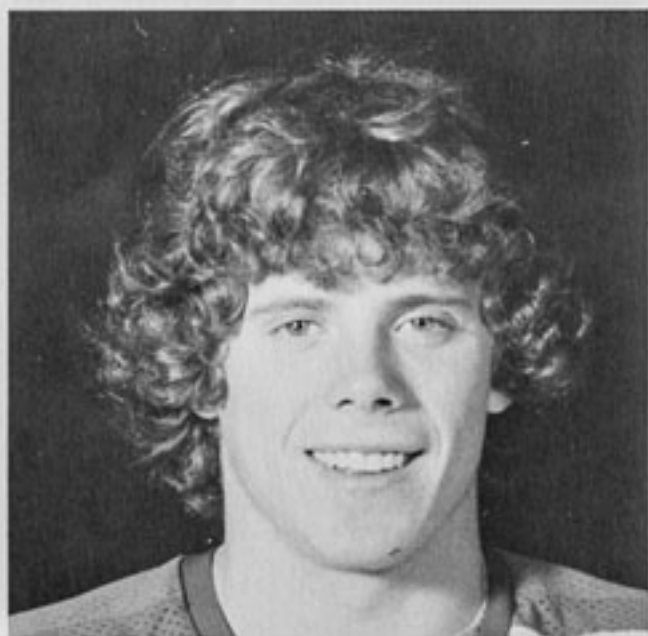

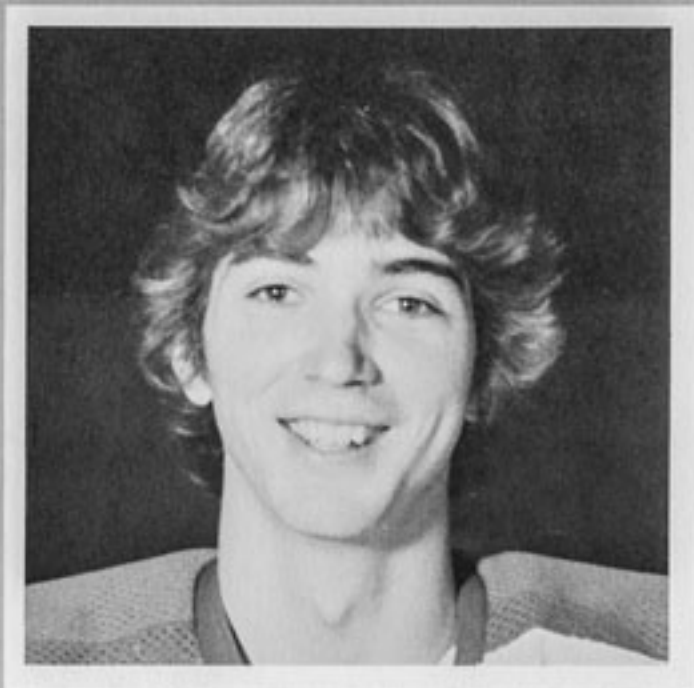

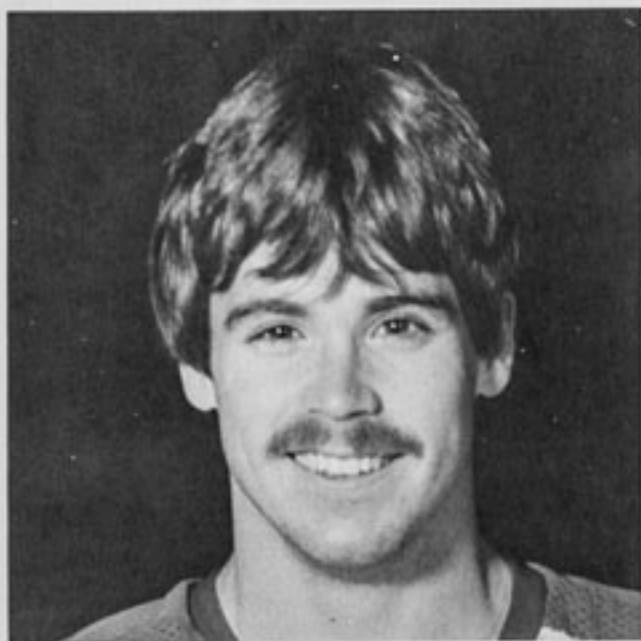

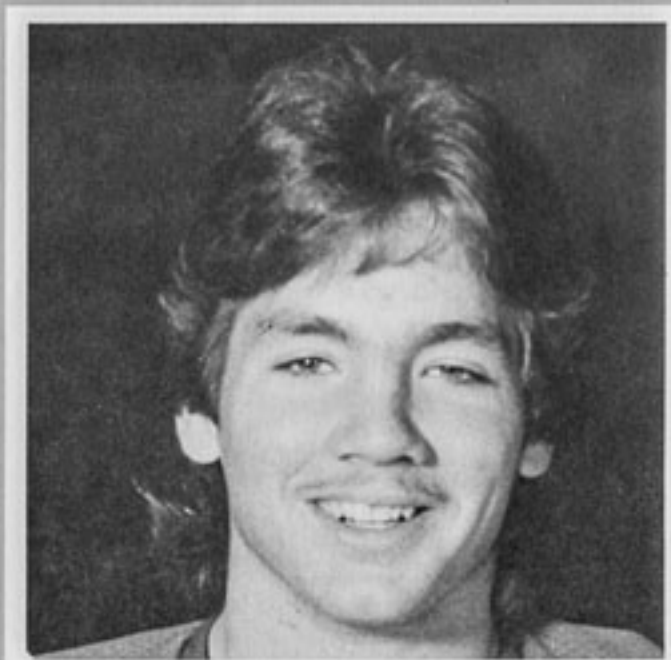

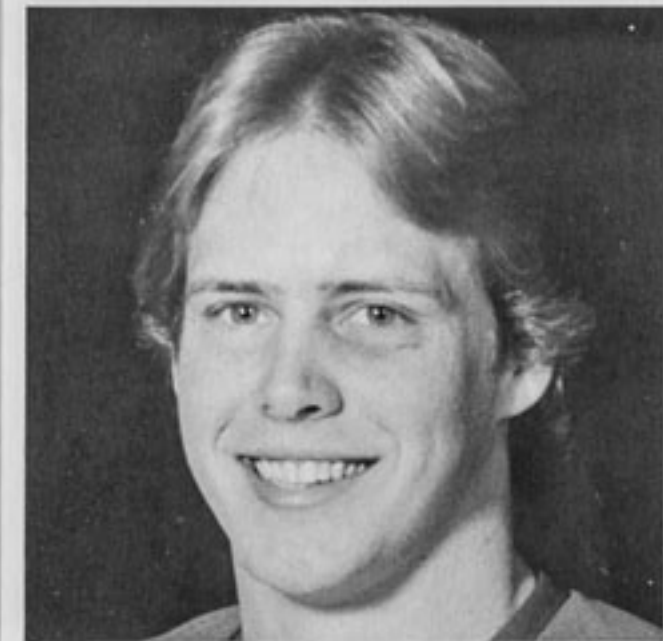

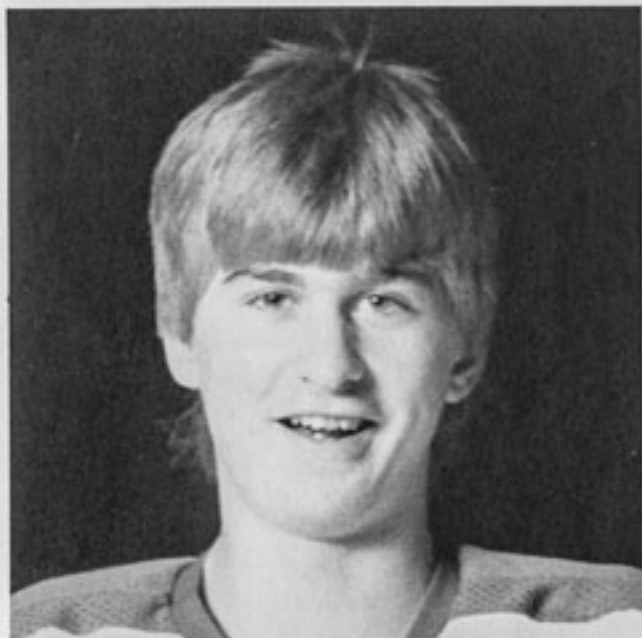

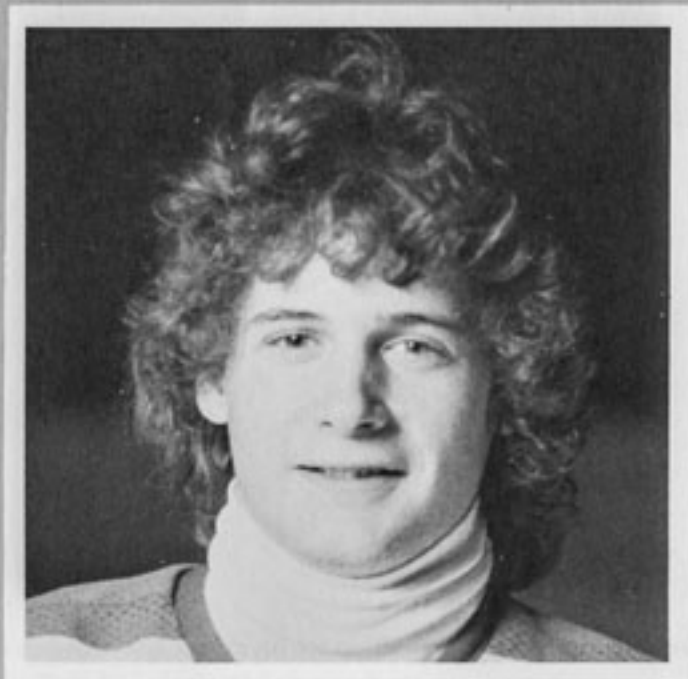
#20 DAVE WALLENSTEIN — POSITION: WING

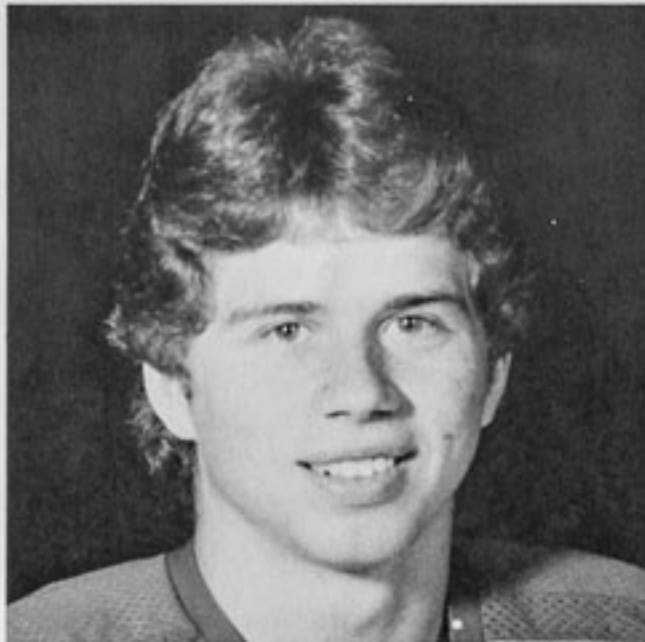

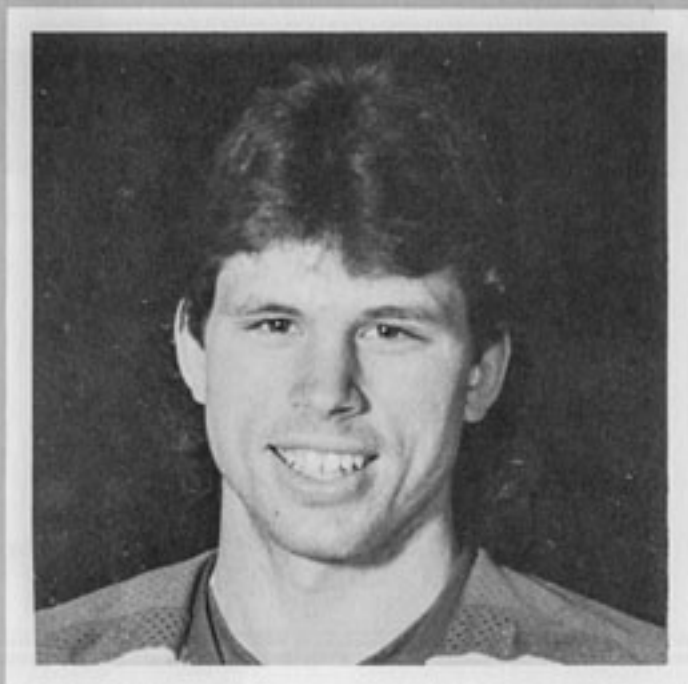


A checking Daryl Seltenreich #11 "lays the lumber" in an effort to prevent a goal.

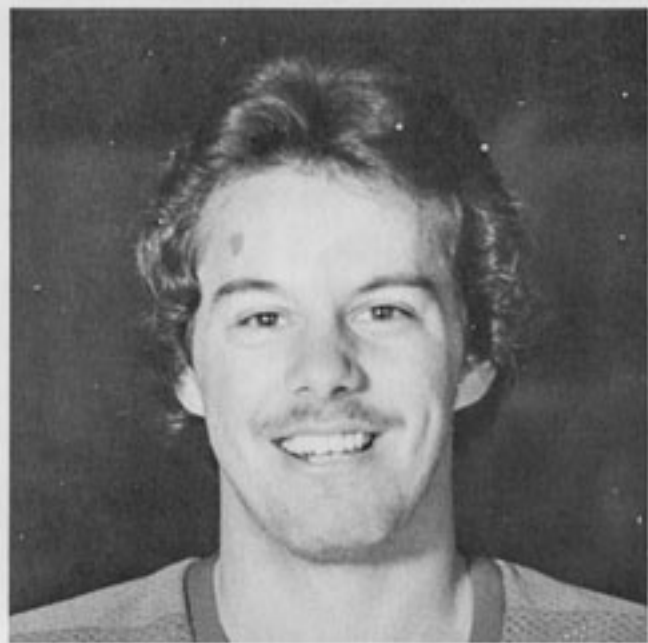

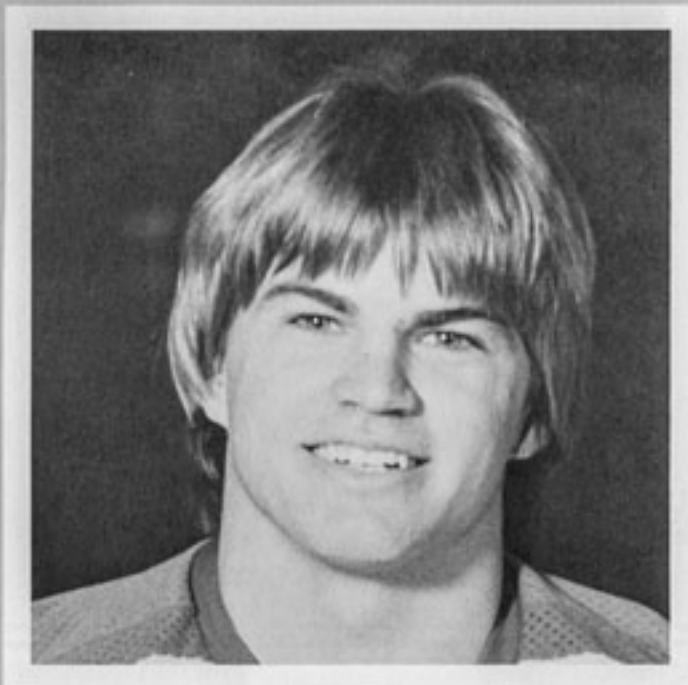


#12 GREG LADOUCEUR — POSITION: LEFT WING

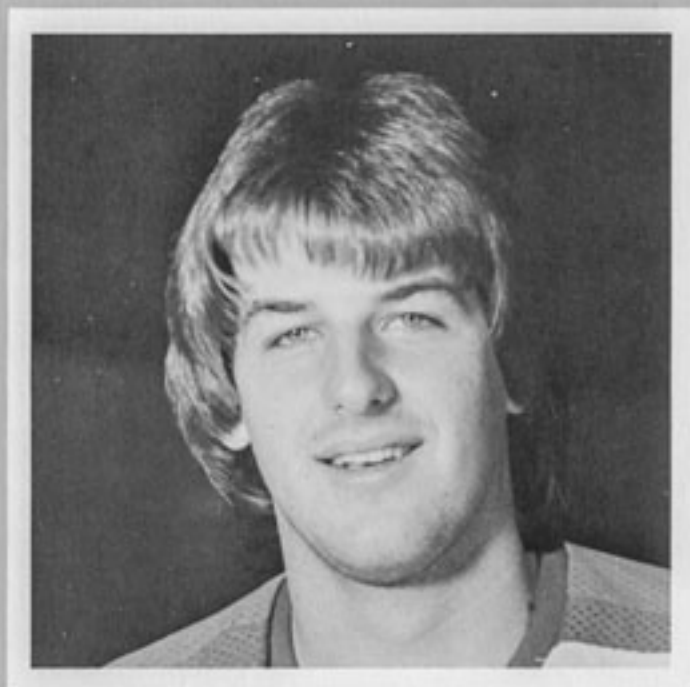

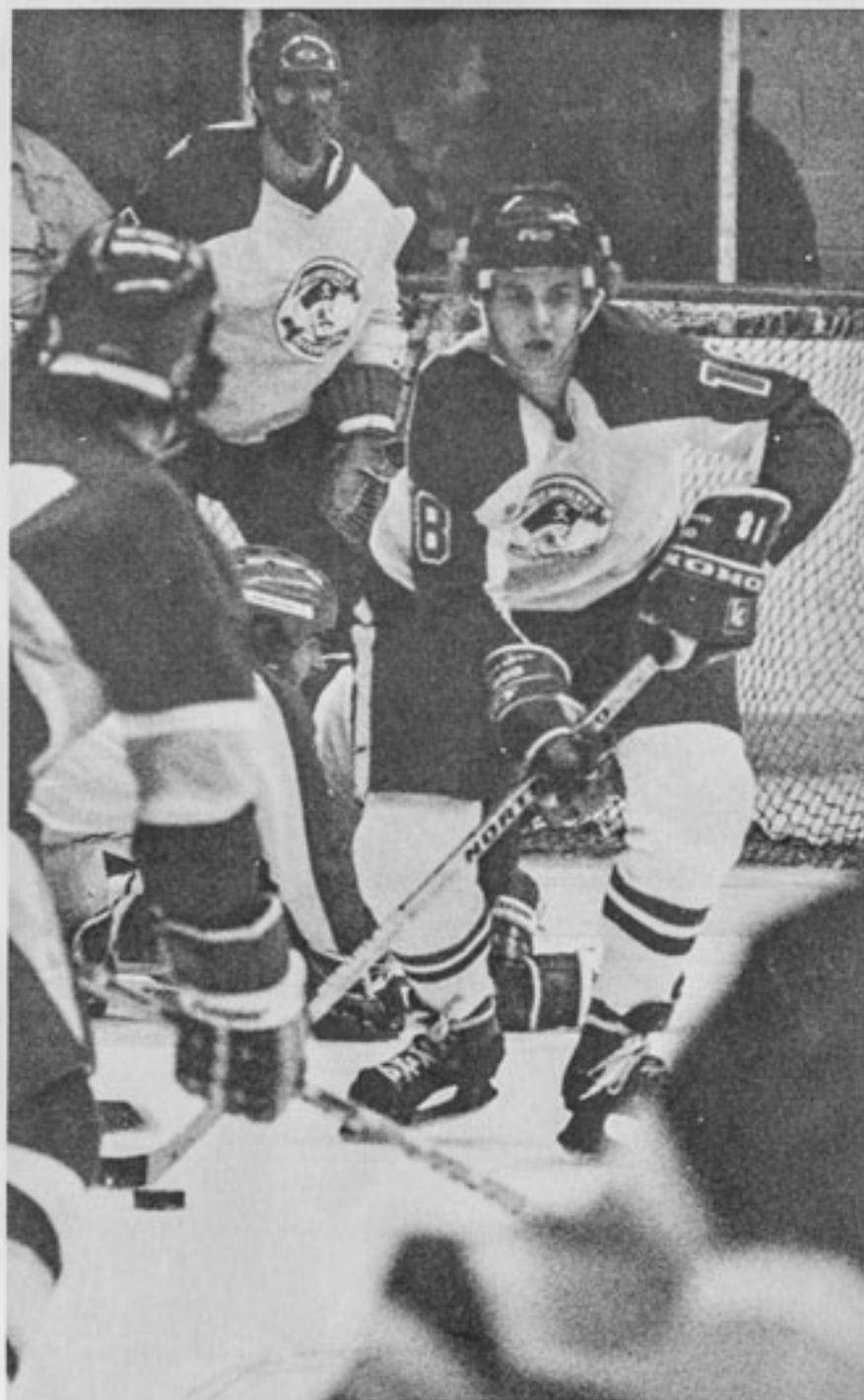

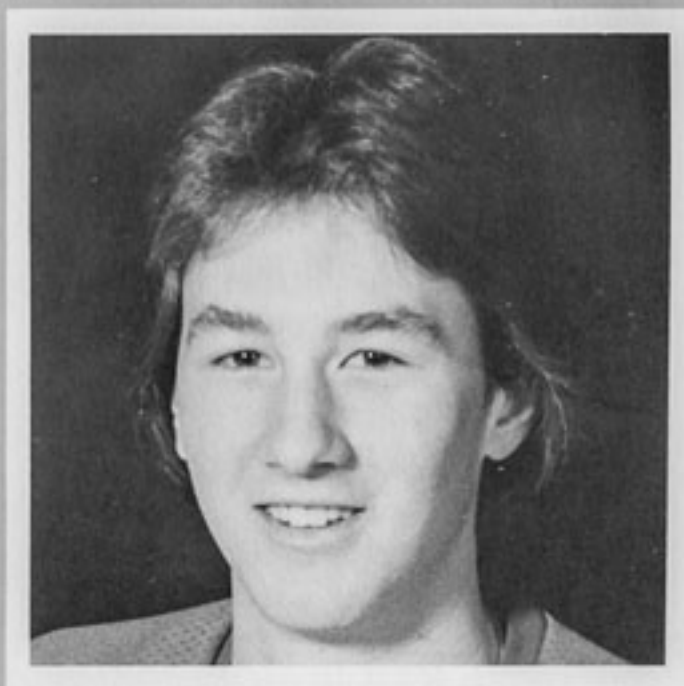
