



n behalf of the entire United States
Hockey League, allow me to extend to
you a warm welcome to this evening's
competition. Hockey continues to be the most
exciting, hard-hitting, fast moving, competitive sport
in North America. U.S.H.L. hockey competition,
tonight, here and throughout the league, and
throughout the season, continues to be the best
entertainment sports value in the midwestern market,
on either side of the border.

After the 1991-92 season, we are back to the question, "Can you top this???" Unbelievably, for the seventh year in a row, a U.S.H.L. team was crowned United States National Junior "A" Champion, as the Des Moines Buccaneers became the fifth different U.S.H.L. team to contribute to this winning streak. Coach Ferguson started this streak behind the Sioux City Musketeers bench, and now has captured his second National title, behind the Buccaneer bench. On the other side of the border, the Thunder Bay Flyers continued to demonstrate U.S.H.L. excellence to the Canadian hockey community as they successfully captured their second Centennial Cup — the symbol of the Canadian National Junior "A" Championship — in the last four years.

Our true success is measured by the contribution we make to the advancement of the careers of our participants — players, coaches, and referees. Last season, 1991-92, a standard was established which will be difficult to equal or surpass. Almost fifty percent of the competitors, 99 players to be exact, advanced to compete on behalf of NCAA institutions after last season — 61 athletes to Division I on scholarship assistance, 17 athletes to Division I as walk-ons with promise of assistance later, and 21 athletes to Division III on some financial aid package. For the second time in our history, the National Hockey League saw fit to pick one of our participants in the first round of the Annual N.H.L. Draft when the New York Rangers claimed Peter Ferraro (twin brother Chris was a fourth-round pick of the Rangers). A total of nine athletes with U.S.H.L. experi-





ence were selected by the N.H.L. in last year's draft. Finally, when Peter Ferraro was selected to the All Tournament Team at the World Junior Tournament, he became the first U.S.H.L. player ever to be honored in this way. From a coaching perspective, we lost one more coach to the NCAA Division I coaching ranks, when Bob Motzko left for Miami of Ohio. Former coaches Kevin Constantine and Jim Wiley led the Kansas City Blades to the International Hockey League Professional Championship during the regular season and the playoffs. Dave Siciliano was selected as an Assistant Junior Olympic Festival. From a referee's perspective, we lost Greg Yerage to the professionals, Jay Knudtson is moving on into International competition, and Don Adam was selected as the United States' referee to work in the Olympic Games. We are pleased that all three of these gentlemen worked in the United States Hockey League last year.

With the record noted above, it would be easy to relax and enjoy our accomplishments. However, the record was achieved by hard work and the entire League looks ahead to this season and to aggressively meeting the challenge of becoming even better than our history.

We have the greatest fans in North America. You, as the fan, can also be a contributor to the continuation and improvement of our outstanding tradition. You, the fan, do make a difference! Your positive support of your players, coaches and team, both on and off the ice, can and will significantly assist all of us in maintaining the high caliber of competition we enjoy in our League.

Please — be a "Good host!" Tonight, spend a little extra time and effort to extend a warm United States Hockey League welcome to the visiting team and fans in your arena. Your support, both now and in the past, makes it possible for all of us to sit back and enjoy Junior "A" Hockey at its finest — U.S.H.L.-style.





Do you know your HOCKEY VOCABULARY?

Back Check (Legal) Attempts by the forwards on their way back to the their defensive zone to regain the puck from the opposition.

Boarding (Illegal) Violently forcing an opponent into the boards.

Body Check (Legal) Using hip or shoulder to slow or stop an opponent with the puck.

Breakaway The puck carrier getting ahead of all opponents except the goalkeeper.

Breakout When a team leaves their defensive zone with the puck.

Charging (Illegal) Taking 2 or more strides before checking an opponent.

Cross Checking (Illegal) Hitting an opponent with both hands on the stick and no part of the stick on the ice.

Drop Pass Puck carrier leaves the puck behind for a trailing teammate to pick up.

Fore Check Keeping opponents at their own end of the ice while attempting to regain the possession of the puck.

Freezing the Puck Holding the puck against the boards with stick or skates.

Hat Trick Three goals scored by one player in one game.

High Sticking (Illegal) Carrying the stick above shoulder level.

Headmanning Passing the puck forward to a teammate farther up the ice.

Interference (Illegal) Hindering or restraining a player not immediately involved in playing the puck.

Neutral Zone Center ice between the blue lines.


Penalty Box Area off ice where penalized players serve their "sentence."

Poke Check (Legal) Stabbing at the puck with the blade of the stick to try to take it away from the puck carrier.

Power Play While an opposing team is short handed due to penalty, the team with the manpower advantage sends five men into the attacking zone.

Slap Shot Bringing the stick back and swinging it quickly forward, slapping the puck toward the goal.

Splitting The Defense Man with the puck goes between two defenders.

The History of the Bucs in the United States Hockey League

The USHL can trace its origins back to the Midwest Junior Hockey League that was formed in 1972. It merged with the old U.S. Hockey League five years later, and returned to competition with all juniors in 1979.

Since that time the USHL has been a league for players under the age of 20. The Des Moines Buccaneers joined the league for the 1980-81 season. Under the guidance of Coach/GM Ivan Prediger, the Bucs compiled a 23-25-0 record in their first season, which was good for second place behind Dubuque in the South Division.

Ivan lead the team until November 1984, when former Bucs standout, Jeff Ulrich, filled in as interim coach for a half dozen games until Jim Wiley took over the helm of the Bucs' ship in December. The team struggled through rough waters that season, winning just seven games, until 1986-87 when they sailed to 23 wins.

Prior to the 1990-91 season, Wiley left the Buccaneers and is now working as an assistant coach for the Kansas City Blades in the San Jose Sharks organization. This left the Buccaneers board of directors the task of finding the strongest coach/teacher/general manager available. Bob Ferguson, who spent nine years with the Musketeers in Sioux City, has fit the bill very well. In his first two seasons with Des Moines he has led the Bucs to two-second place finishes, last year winning the Clark Cup as league playoff champions.

The team then won the national championship in their first trip to that tournament. That victory also made Bob Ferguson the first coach to win the nationals with two different teams.

Bob Ferguson led the Buccaneers to two championships in 1991-92.

ob Ferguson returns for his third year at the helm of the Buccaneers' ship. Once again Bob led the team to its best record ever, finishing in second place in the regular season... just one point behind Thunder Bay. The Bucs rallied to win the Clark Cup as Playoff Champions by beating Sioux City, St. Paul and Dubuque. A berth in the National Tournament... a goal he and the team had worked towards... was realized last April when they were crowned National Champions in Omaha.

Bob hails from Kingston, Ontario, where he grew up in a family that knows hockey success (his father, Lorne, was an 11-year veteran of the NHL). Bob played Major Junior "A" for the Oshawa Generals and Cornwall Royals before being drafted by the New York Islanders.

After playing professional hockey for seven years, he began his coaching career with the Sioux City Musketeers in 1980. During his nine seasons there, Bob's teams won two USHL Championships and two Playoff Championships and made four

National Tournament appearances, culminating with the National Championship in 1986.

This past summer Bob coached at the U.S. Olympic Training Camp where his team of Select 18 year-olds won the festival tournament held in Lake Placid.




Hockey's Three Main Rules...

Learn these rules and you will know the principles that control the flow of the game.

Icing the puck

Icing occurs when a player shoots the puck from his defending side of the red line, across the goal line of his opponent (but not through any part of the goal crease) and it is then touched first by a defending player. When icing occurs the linesmen stop play and the puck is moved to the offending team's end of the ice for a face-off. Icing is not called (waved off) when the goalie plays the puck, or in the opinion of the up-ice linesman, a defending player could have played the puck before it crossed the goal line.






Offside pass

When a player passes the puck from his defending zone to a teammate beyond the center reline (thus crossing the blue and red lines) it is an offside pass. The position of the puck, not the players' skates in this case, determines from which zone the pass was made.

These three rules have the primary purpose of requiring teams to control possession of the puck through skating skills, stick handling and short passes, as they move from their defending zone up ice to attack their opponent's goal.

Offside

A team is offside when any member of the attacking team precedes the puck across the defending team's blue line. The position of the player's skates and not his body or stick is the determining factor. If both skates are across the blue line before the puck, he is offside. If one skate is across and the other is on or behind the blue line, he is not offside.





Here's what those six players are doing out there...

It's organized mayhem, but each has a distinct job to do.

The Goalie

The goalkeepers' main responsibility is to keep the puck from entering his goal. There are no restrictions placed on the methods he may employ to accomplish this. He can contribute to his team's offense by passing the puck to a teammate to start a rush up the ice. Occasionally a goalie will receive credit for an assist when that rush leads to a goal by his team. Goalies are limited to handling the puck in their own half of the ice and may not touch it once they cross the red line. (An example would be when he is headed for his bench after a delayed penalty has been signaled on the other team.)


The Defensemen

In their defensive end, the two defensemen try to turn back the incoming play at their own blue line before their opponents can bring it into their defending zone. When the puck does enter their zone, the "D" guard the opposing forwards, block shots, clear rebounds from in front of their goal, steal the puck and pass to their own forwards who lead a "break out" up ice towards their opponents goal. Offensively, the defensemen can carry the puck or pass to an open forward. It is a defensive player's responsibility to guard the "point" in the offensive end and keep the puck from coming out of the attacking zone.

Often on a power play, a big defenseman will rotate to a position in front of the enemy goalie to disrupt the normal defensive play of the short handed team.

The Forwards

These are the guys who generally carry the puck up ice to attack the opponent's goal. They are usually, but not always, smaller and quicker than the defensemen. The Center plays between the Right and Left Wingers as play begins. Today's style



of play finds the forwards in constant motion as they skate to find open ice to receive a pass from their teammates. However, Wingers generally skate up and down their side of the rink and must have the courage to go into the offensive corners and challenge bigger, stronger defensemen for the puck. Centers are the ones who line up to take the face-off, and for the most part try to control center lane of the rink. They are considered the quarterback of their line (three forwards are usually teamed-up as a "line" together).

Specialty Players

When a team has to skate short-handed due to a penalty, or has a power-play situation in their favor, the coach will often put a player in a position that he normally would not play if the teams were at even strength. The idea is to make the best use of a player's individual strength. For example, when playing short-handed there is no center, so a coach may play his two most agile, defensive-minded forwards, without regard to their ability to shoot the puck. He is looking to keep the opponent from scoring, not scoring himself until the penalty is "killed." When on a power play, many times a good play-making forward will handle one point as a defenseman moves in front of the goalie, thus upsetting the other team's defensive balance and creating an opening to attack the net and score.

1991-92... What a season!

Tednesday night, April 9, 1992, Des Moines forward Randy Hankinson fired the biggest goal of his career past Dubuque goalie Eustace King to mark a milestone in Buccaneer history. With that overtime goal, Des Moines won its first-ever Clark Cup, the trophy awarded to the USHL playoff champions.

But the Bucs were not through making history. They traveled to Omaha to represent the USHL in the national championships. They tore through the Detroit Ir. Red Wings, 8-4, to open the tournament. The next day they slipped by the Indianapolis Ice, 5-3. Friday afternoon they met up with prennial NAJHL powerhouse Detroit Compuware... and put them away, 7-4.

In the semi-final game on Satrurday against Indianapolis, the Bucs jumped out to a commanding five-goal lead. Midway through the third period the Ice finally were able to slip a goal past goalie Paul Sass and put and end to his shutout bid. Without hestitation, Coach Ferguson called Sass to the bench. He sent the two-year veteran Kevin Deschambeault in to finish the game. The large crowd of Des Moines fans who made the pilgrimage to Omaha welcomed Kevin by chanting "DAY-CHAM-BEAU!...DAY-CHAM-BEAU!" Then

they showed their appreciation for Paul's outstanding efforts by calling out in unison, "THANK YOU SASS!" The chants brought tears to the eyes of Paul's parents as his father exclaimed, "I've never seen a crowd do that in all my years of watching hockey." It was truely a moving

event in the twelve-year history of the Buccaneer franchise.

But, the crowning moment came on Easter Sunday when USHL President David Tyler presented the trophy to the National Champions...the Des Moines Buccaneers...after they routed the Detroit Compuware team again. This time the score was 9–1, before 3,398 screaming fans, the largest crowd ever to wittness a Junior National final game.

The championship was the seventh straight for the USHL. Sioux City, led then by our own Bob Ferguson, started the string in 1986. With the victory in '92, he became the first coach to win the championship with two different teams.

Of the championships, Bob said, "The first one was special because it was my first one. But also because my brother Tim scored the winning goal in overtime to win it. But we won that one with talent. This one, we won as a team. I know it sounds corny when you use words like 'mission' and 'focus,' but they've been a team all year. They've relied on each other from the beginning. This is as close of a team as I've coached."

The Bucs fell short of only one objective last season. In the final game of the regular season, they dropped a 4–2 decision in St. Paul to finish one



point behind Thunder Bay for the season championship. Despite that loss, 1991-92 was the most successful season in franchise history. Winning 35, lossing just 11, with 2 ties and one bonus point for an overtime loss, gave them 73 points for the year...and another goal for the 92-93 season.



Here's What Those Referee Signals Mean...

BOARDING

Pounding the closed fist of one hand into the other. Called for driving opponent into boards.



HOLDING

Clasping the wrists in front of the chest. Called for using hands on opponent or his equipment.



SLASHING

Chopping with one hand across the opposite forearm. Called for swinging stick at the opponent.



CHARGING

Rotating clenched fists in front of chest. Called for taking more than 3 strides before checking opponent.




INTERFERENCE

Crossed arms in front of chest with fists closed. Called for having contact with opponent not in possession of puck.



SPEARING

A jabbing motion with both hands in front of the body. Called for using the stick like a spear.



motion with fists extending from the chest. Called for hitting opponent with both hands on the stick & no part of stick on the ice.



Tugging motion with arms, as called for using stick or blade to hook opponent.



TRIPPING

Strike the right leg with the right hand below the knee. Called for using stick, arm, or leg to cause the opponent to trip or fall.




DELAYED CALLING OF PENALTY

Referee extends arm and points to penalized player until penalized team regains possession of puck.



KNEEING

Slapping the knee with palm of hand.
Called when using knee to impede opponent.



Both arms swung across the body with palms down. When used by the referee, it means goal disallowed; by the linesmen it means no off-side or icing.



Tapping the elbow with the opposite hand. Called when using elbow to impede opponent.



MISCONDUCT

Place both hands on hips.
Called for various forms of misconduct or when a player incurs a second major penalty in a game.



Use both hands to form a "T" in front of the chest.



HIGH-STICKING 🐬

Holding both fists, clenched, one above the other at the side of the head. Called for carrying stick above shoulder against opponent.



ROUGHING

A thrusting motion with the arm extending from the side. Called for engaging in fisticuffs or shoving.



ICING

Linesmen's arms folded across the upper chest.
